



Department of Anaesthesiology



BLS (CPR) Training: Anesthesia team including Dr Reema wadhawa, Dr Monika shah headed by Dr Heena Chhanwal conducted hands on training in Basic life support course of 35 nursing staff from ICU, OT, Casuality and Pre and post operative Nursing staff on 17 June 2019.



Psoas Compartment Block (PCB)

A 62 years male patient diagnosed with left neck of femur fracture was posted for bipolar hemiarthroplasty. The patient was cachexic, malnourished & has short stature with barrelshaped chest. The patient had the past history of pulmonary koch's 40 years ago for which AKT was taken for 6 months. The patient had the past history of exploratory laparotomy 30 years ago for intestinal obstruction. On respiratory examination,

there was generalised decrease in air entry throughout the chest with presence of rhonchi on the left chest region. Chest X-ray findings were suggestive of fibrocalcified lesions & collapse of left upper & mid



zones along with left sided pleural effusion & right upper lobe collapse with pulling of trachea towards right side & shifting of mediastinum towards left side. Arterial blood gas analysis showed partial pressure of oxygen of 83.4 % with pH within normal range. Pulmonary Function Tests (PFT) showed restrictive pattern of lung disease with predictability of 27.5 %. On palpation of pulse, 6-8 misbeats/min were noted in both radial arteries & on

auscultation, prominent mid-systolic murmur was heard. ECG was suggestive of irregular heart rhythm &

atrial premature contractions (APCs). 2D-ECHO shown LVEF=55% with mitral valve prolapsed (MVP) with mild mitral regurgitation (MR). Patient was started on tablet metoprolol 25mg OD & tablet dytor 10mg OD 2 days prior to surgery.

After complete evaluation, General anaesthesia (GA) was not possible because




with this condition of lungs, GA can lead to V/Q mismatch, difficulty in maintaining inhaled anaesthetist concentration, difficulty in maintaining proper oxygenation & can lead to bronchospasm & long term ventilatory support. Spinal anaesthesia (SA) was not possible because of cachexic nature of body buildup & presence of mitral valve abnormality with decrease cardiac reserve. Hence, it was decided to proceed with psoas compartment block.

After establishing wide-bore IV cannula, starting IV fluids & starting haemodynamic monitoring, patient was given right lateral position. As premedication, inj

midazolam 1mg & inj glycopyrrolate 0.2 mg was administered. Under USG guidance & using peripherial nerve stimulator, psoas compartment was localised & in that also, psoas muscle was identified & inj bupivacaine (0.5%) 10ml + inj lignocaine-adrenaline (2%) 10ml was injected. The effect of psoas compartment block was assessed &



with confirmation of loss of sensation over surgery site and no pain on manipulation of fracture site, patient was given position for surgery. Incision was placed 15 minutes after giving psoas compartment block. Throughout the intra-operative, patient remained haemodynamically stable & surgery got completed without any adverse events.



The case was successfully handled by Dr. Bipin Shah, Dr. Deepa Jadav, Dr. Hitesh Chellani & team of anaesthesia department.

Unanticipated Difficult Intubation

A 66 years woodcutter male patient presented with low back pain & h/o fall down 4 times in last 2 years & diagnosed as L4-L5spinal canal block with the help of MRI& posted for spine fixation surgery. Patient was a k/c/o left leg filariasis on treatment & h/o IHD 1.5 years ago. On pre-operative checkup, mild thyroid swelling & diagnosed as hypothyroidism. Tab thyronorm 50mcg 1 OD started. Airway assessment revealed no abmormality. All investigations including ECG, 2D-

ECHO & X-ray Neck lateral view were within normal limit. The patient was posted under ASA-3. Surgery was planned to be taken place in prone position & hence patient was to be induced & intubated on stretcher. After

establishing large bore IV cannula, starting IV fluids & establishing haemodynamic monitoring, pre-oxygenation was started. After injecting optimum doses of pre-medication (inj glycopyrrolate 0.2mg, inj midazolam 1mg & fentanyl 100mcg), induction was started using inj propofol 130mg. After establishing optimum check ventilation using bag & mask ventilation, inj succinylcholine 100mcg injected. On 1st attempt of intubation using Macintosh blade no.4, only

epiglottis was viewed & on lifting epiglottis from its base, neither vocal cords nor arytenoids were visible. After that, intubation was tried using McCoy's blade, BURP manoeurve & bougie, but intubation didn't took place. During this period, senior anaesthetists were called, inj dexamethasone 8mg & inj hydrocortisone 100mg were administered & during this entire period, oxygenation & haemodynamics were maintained. After optimum pre-oxygenation for another 3 minutes & injecting optimum dose of inducing agent & muscle

relaxation, fibre-optic intubating scope was used for intubation but even after 3 attempts, intubation couldn't take place. Finally, Intubating LMA (Blockbuster LMA) with its dedicated armoured re-inforced tube no

7.5mm for intubation were used & atlast, airway was secured & intubating LMA with its tube were properly fixed. Patient was given prone position & surgery got commenced. Intra-operative period was uneventful, successfully extubated & shifted to ICU on O2 mask & shifted to ward after 24 hours.

The case was successfully handled by Dr. Heena Chhanwal, Dr. Bipin Shah, Dr. Deepa Jadav, Dr. Hitesh Chellani and team of anaesthesia.
